



Mr. Alfred "Casey" Workman

April 9, 1929 - May 31, 2017

Alfred "Casey" Workman passed away Wednesday morning, May 31, 2017 while at his home in Willow Springs. Born on April 9, 1929 in Greenbrier County , West Virginia , to the late James Patrick and Matilda Mahala (Baldwin) Workman.

He served in the Army/Air Force from 1947 - 1950. He worked at Glenn L. Martin Aircraft and was a dairy and crop farmer for most of his life. He was a Soil Conservation Farmer of the Year in 1973. He loved to help people, but his favorite past-time was to "tell" elaborate stories, which might've been embellished here and there somewhat.

Alfred married Ida M. Beavers on February 19, 1955, and to this union five children were born. He and Ida also have ten grandchildren and eight great-grandchildren. Surviving are his wife of 62 years, Ida; his children, Pat (Lois) Workman of Conowingo, Maryland ; Charlotte Parks of Wooster, Ohio; Darlene Workman of the home; Eric (Tina) Workman of Oshkosh, Wisconsin, and Tracy Workman of Jensen Beach , Florida .
