Floyd Hiler, a lifelong resident of Willow Springs, passed away Saturday, October 31, 2020, while at Willow Care Nursing Home. Floyd was born February 21, 1930 to Charles Theodore and Rose Idella (Wilson) Hiler in Willow Springs and was 90 years old.

He and his brother-in-law, Gary Trogdon, loved to go riding around in Floyd's truck affectionately known as "Ole Greenie." Floyd loved to talk, and it has been said that he never met a stranger.

Floyd is preceded in death by his parents; his son, Kevin; his daughter, Heidi, and his brother, Sherman Hiler.
