



Mr. Ronald "Ron" G. Webb

June 9, 1949 - May 1, 2019

Ronald "Ron" Guy Webb, a resident of Willow Springs, stepped out into eternity a little after midnight on Wednesday, May 1, 2019, at the age of 69 years. He was born June 9, 1949 in West Plains, MO to Harold Lester and Velma (Haddock) Webb.

Ron spent his childhood in the Dry Creek area of Willow Springs, MO. Ron graduated from Willow Springs High School then attended college for one and half years at Arkansas State University. On June 20, 1969, Ron married his special sweetheart, Janie Longnecker, at Dry Creek Church. Ron and Janie dated 2 ½ years before marrying and surpassed 50 years together.

Ron and Janie had three beautiful children together: Stacy, Adam, and Nathan. Ron was extremely proud of all three of his children and bragged on them to all who would listen.

Ron worked for Pepsi Cola Bottling Company for many years, making lifelong friendships with both coworkers and customers. In his mid-thirties, Ron went back to college and obtained a bachelor's degree in education. He received, eventually, his master's degree, also. Ron taught middle school math in the Liberty, Cabool, and Willow Springs School Districts.

Ron became a Christian as a young boy and spent his adult life serving his Lord in many ways. Ron was a Sunday School teacher many times, as well as

serving as a deacon in three different churches. In 1989, Ron became a member of The Gideons International, serving as the Missouri state president for three years. While serving in the Gideons, Ron was blessed to travel throughout all of Missouri, as well as to Thailand and Mexico, on Bible distribution missions. Ron spoke in many local churches as a Gideon and enjoyed every minute of it. The friends he made in the Gideons were precious brothers to him.

Volunteerism was an important part of Ron's life, and after he retired from teaching, he had the opportunity to travel with The Southern Baptist Disaster Relief Teams to multiple states, providing spiritual and physical help to those impacted by natural disasters. Ron also spent many hours at MUNCH in Willow Springs, donating his time to help his fellow man and woman in need. Another area Ron gave of himself was in donating blood for as long as he was healthy enough to do so. This past winter, a local blood drive was held to honor his dedication to always donate blood whenever the bloodmobile was in town.

Ron leaves behind a loving family, including his wife, Janie; children: Stacy McNeill and son-in-law, Andrew; Adam Webb and fiancée, Jaime Bryan; and Nathan Webb; grandchildren: Grant McNeill, Zeke Webb and his mother, Lulu; Molly McNeill, Zoey Bryan, and Luke and Nora McNeill. He is also survived by his sister, Gini Scudder, and brother-in-law, Dave; and by his stepsister, Shirley Danielson. Preceding him in death were his parents, Harold Webb and Velma (Webb) Duddridge; his stepfather, Leonard Duddridge; paternal and maternal grandparents; and step-brother, Leroy Duddridge.

Visitation is scheduled for Friday, May 3, 2019 from 6:00 PM to 8:00 PM at the First Baptist Church in Willow Springs. Funeral services will be held Saturday, May 4, 2019 at 2:00 PM at the First Baptist Church with friend and Pastor Joel Hinds officiating. Burial will be in the Dry Creek Cemetery, off Z Highway in

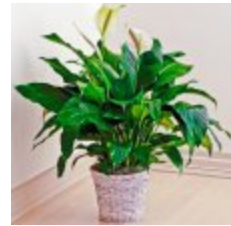
